Since 1991, the National Cooperative Bank (NCB) has published the annual NCB Co-op 100, a ranking of America's top 100 cooperatives. In 2024, these member-owned, member-controlled businesses generated an impressive \$322.6 billion in revenue. Many of the organizations featured are household names, recognized not only across the United States but also around the world.

In 2025, the United Nations' International Year of Cooperatives brings global attention to the vital role cooperatives play in sustainable development. Under the theme, "Cooperatives Build a Better World," this year-long celebration highlights how co-ops contribute to poverty reduction, economic resilience, and inclusive growth in communities worldwide.

Cooperatives are unique in their structure and purpose. Unlike publicly traded companies, co-ops exist to serve their member-owners, not outside shareholders. This model fosters deeper accountability, trust, and shared success.

Cooperatives reinvest in their communities, pay taxes, provide employment to millions, and deliver high-quality products and services—locally and globally.

From agriculture and energy to finance and hardware, cooperatives—whether over 100 years old or newly emerging—are helping to shape a more equitable, innovative, and sustainable world.

While co-ops vary in industries, what they all have in common is embracing the values and principles that make us truly unique.

Co-ops are an everyday part of American life. Wherever you live, work or shop, it is likely a cooperative is involved. You'll see a co-op in action at the credit union where you bank. In the brand names in your grocery store aisles. In the morning paper.

A cooperative is a business organized, owned and controlled by the people who use its products and services. Today, 1 in 3 Americans are a member of a co-op.

Co-ops operate for the benefit of their member-owners. They take advantage of economies of scale, combined buying power and strength in numbers to save money and return profits to their members. In the process, co-ops provide millions of jobs, support businesses and personal needs and enhance the quality of life.

To this very day, Ace Hardware Corporation is still owned solely and exclusively by the local Ace retail entrepreneurs.

From Humble Beginnings to Industry Leadership

What began in 1946 as a small, local cooperative formed by eight visionary grocery store owners has grown into Wakefern Food Corp., the largest retailer-owned cooperative in the United States. Headquartered in New Jersey, Wakefern is now a vibrant network of member families who proudly own and operate hundreds of supermarkets under beloved banners including ShopRite, Price Rite Marketplace, The Fresh Grocer, Dearborn Market, Gourmet Garage, Fairway Market, Di Bruno Bros., and Morton Williams.

Wakefern's unique cooperative model empowers local, family-owned businesses to thrive and compete alongside multinational chains. Today, its member companies serve communities across nine states: New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Connecticut, Maryland, Delaware, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, and Rhode Island.

Guided by a mission to help small businesses succeed in a big business world, Wakefern is equally committed to building stronger, healthier communities. Its members live and work in the neighborhoods they serve, supporting thousands of local organizations and charities. As a recognized leader in both the supermarket industry and corporate responsibility, Wakefern also proudly champions the fight against food insecurity through its signature initiative, ShopRite Partners In Caring.

Smaller Co-ops Make a Difference Too

What you see on the NCB Co-op 100® are the top 100 revenue-grossing cooperatives in America. Thousands more do not make this list because of their smaller size, and some are just emerging co-op organizations. This past year, in partnership with Capital Impact Partners, we provided five co-op innovation awards to co-ops making an impact in communities.

In 2025 the award pool was expanded through a generous grant from CoBank and sponsorships from National Co-op Grocers; Ford & Paulekas, LLC; Gallagher Evelius & Jones LLP; Loeb & Loeb LLP; and Velocity Consulting, Inc.



2025 Co-op Innovation Award Recipients

Nashville Equitable Housing Cooperative (Nashville, TN) - \$50,000

Nashville Equitable Housing Collaborative (NEHC) is a coalition of grassroots organizations advancing cooperative housing solutions across Tennessee. In 2024, NEHC developed its first 60-unit limited-equity affordable housing cooperative, a major achievement in a state where co-op resources and funding are scarce. To build on this success, it will use the grant funding to develop the Cooperative Community Playbook to document Tennessee-specific strategies, legal frameworks, and engagement tools that will expand affordable cooperative housing.



U.S. Federation of Worker Cooperatives (Chicago, IL) - \$30,000

The U.S. Federation of Worker Cooperatives (USFCW) serves as the only national membership organization focused on advancing economic opportunities through cooperative worker ownership. USFCW will use the grant to launch the Win-Win Childcare Initiative, which pilots a scalable model linking unions and worker co-ops to incubate childcare businesses. This initiative will deliver quality care, quality jobs, and a replicable path for leveraging union assets toward economic development for childcare workers.



Fideicomiso Comunitario Tierra Libre (Los Angeles, CA) - \$40,000

Comunitario Tierra Libre is a nonprofit community land trust dedicated to creating and preserving permanently affordable housing for residents living with low incomes in the Los Angeles neighborhoods of Boyle Heights and East Los Angeles. Through FCTL, the Tonalli Tenant Association will use the \$40,000 grant to create East Los Angeles' first housing cooperative, fostering long-term economic sustainability through collective investment, shared governance, and community cooperation.



Farm Generations Cooperative (Cooperstown, NY)- \$50,000

Farm Generations Cooperative was formed to create a farmer-owned marketing platform for producers selling food directly to their communities. It has helped to provide access to healthy food for families living with low incomes by developing accessible technologies for farmers to accept SNAP, WIC, Double Up Food Bucks, and produce prescriptions. Farm Generations Cooperative will use the grant to replicate and expand the program regionally in addition to documenting the success of its food access work for farms across the country.



Prospera Community Development (Oakland, CA)- \$35,000

Prospera Community Development's (Prospera) mission is to partner with Latina entrepreneurs to launch businesses that foster cooperation, economic independence, and well-being in immigrant communities. Recently Prospera launched Comunidades Prospera, which is a structured series of courses presented in Spanish that enable community-based organizations to advance cooperative entrepreneurship, financial autonomy, and collective leadership within their communities. The grant will enable Prospera to scale Comunidades Prospera by creating outreach materials and new strategic partnerships with organizations that are deeply rooted in the community.
